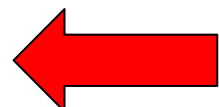
All Members of Valley Retirees Clubs are welcome to attend any or all Events

THE SCHOLARSHIP BOARD HAS KICKED OFF THE 2020-2021 FISCAL YEAR

Since we are still living in the midst of a global pandemic, we won't need ghosts and goblins to scare us this Halloween! It's still in the 100s here in Phoenix even though the calendar says it is officially Fall so we won't be getting out our sweaters any time soon. Of course, you can find pumpkin flavored everything to get you in the mood for Fall when it finally arrives.

April 1st is the deadline for application submission this academic year so be sure you get our information to your student in a timely manner. We have updated our on-line application submission process so please visit the Scholarship web page at www.hrcaz.org to be sure you have the newest information. Here are the criteria:

- You must be a member in good standing of the Honeywell Retiree Social Club or Honeywell-Garrett Retirees Club.
- The college student in your family is a direct descendant (children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren and/or great-great grandchildren).
- The college student in your family is currently enrolled at Arizona State, Northern Arizona or the University of Arizona as either an undergraduate or graduate student and maintaining a 3.0 grade point average (GPA) or better.

If yes to all of the above, then your college student is eligible for a scholarship from the Honeywell Retiree Clubs Scholarship Foundation. This means **FREE MONEY \$\$\$** for your student to aid them with their college expenses, help them achieve their goals in life and become productive members of the community and society. These funds are available to our students through the generous contributions of our retiree club members and Honeywell. The scholarships usually range in value from **\$500-\$1,500 per academic year**, depending on total donations.
