Richard Ray Downey, age 93, of Scottsdale, Arizona passed away on Wednesday, June 7, 2023. Richard "Dick" Downey was born in Zanesville, Ohio, in 1929 to William and Geneva (Starrett) Downey. Following enlistment in the Army and a two-year tour during the Korean Conflict, Dick headed west in the mid 1950's to follow his dream of becoming a cowboy. He worked in the construction of the Glen Canyon Dam then as a bartender at Pinnacle Peak where his love for the old
